MUNICH EXCHANGE GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP**

DEADLINE: APRIL 1, 2010

The Graduate School is pleased to announce the continuation of an arrangement with The University of Munich whereby a Wayne State University graduate student can study in Munich for one academic year while his/her German counterpart attends Wayne.

SELECTION CRITERIA

- United States citizenship or permanent resident status
- Admission to a program of graduate study at Wayne State University
- Proficiency in the German language
- A good academic record and demonstrated capacity for independent study
- Relevancy of study or research program in Munich to program at Wayne State University
- Applicants in the field of medicine must have the M.D. degree at the time of application

FINANCIAL INFORMATION AND OTHER MATTERS

- The Fellowship is adequate to support only the awardee. Consequently, married candidates must be prepared to support their dependents.
- The Fellowship provides one year of study and work experience at the University of Munich with the remission of all tuition fees and a monthly stipend sufficient to meet a single student's normal living expenses for 10 months (October through July)
- The work experience entails a few hours per week in a university institute, the international office or the language center as a teaching assistant/tutor.
- The payment will be 400 Euros (\$584 U.S.). A monthly rent and insurance charge reduces the stipend by approximately \$300 U.S. dollars per month.
- A room in University of Munich housing will be made available to the Wayne State University Fellow.
- Independent travel arrangements should be made. Travel expenses are not included in the Exchange Fellowship.
- Please note that foreign universities generally do not give degrees after only a year of study or research. Therefore, applicants should not make the attainment of a foreign degree the object of their application.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE AND INFORMATION

- Applicants should confer with their advisors before initiating formal application for the Fellowship.
- Applicants should make certain that all parts of the application are submitted by the April 1, 2010 deadline.
- Award notification will be by mail in mid-May 2010.

Therefore, ask a professor in the Department of German and Slavic Languages and Literatures to submit a proficiency report of your language ability to the address listed below.

Submit a concise, comprehensive description of your study or research plans, your reasons for wishing to undertake them at the University of Munich, and how they relate to your program of study and degree objectives

PERSONAL STATEMENT

Submit a narrative statement of yourself as an individual, indicating your personal and educational background, special interests and abilities, and future plans.

- **Submit a Personal Statement**
